

New York State requires a physical examination for students entering school for the first time, as well as students in pre-K, kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11. All students who participate in interscholastic sports and students seeking working papers must be examined by a physician. The examination may be made by the school or family physician. Physicals are available by the school physician at various times throughout the year. In accordance with state regulations, proof of immunization is required when registering for entrance into school. Contact your school nurse for specific information. Pupils may not take prescription or over-the-counter medication while in school unless it is given to them by authorized personnel acting under specific written instruction of the parent or guardian and physician. Self-directed students need to have a written consent signed by the parent or guardian and physician on file in the health office. This includes inhalers carried by students. If your child has medication needs for any day or overnight field trips, please contact the nurse prior to the departure of the trip. Scoliosis screening for spinal curvature is given each year to all fifth through ninth grade students.

#### **MISSION**

### EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSINGS AND DELAYED OPENINGS

If inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances cause schools to be closed, announcements will be made on the following local media outlets: WALK-AM 1370,WALK-FM 97.5, WBLI-FM 106.1 and News 12 Long Island. The District will also make related announcements via the School Notification System and on our website.

Poor weather may delay the opening of school by two hours for all grades. When a delayed opening is called, bus pickup will be two hours later than the regular schedule.

### EMERGENCY CANCELLATION OF SCHOOL DAYS

The District must adhere to strict guidelines governing the number of instructional days to maintain state aid and accreditation. Employees and parents are advised not to make nonrefundable reservations or commitments during the days indicated as make-up days. The following is the schedule for make-up days:

- 0 cancellation days no school 5/26
- 1 cancellation day no change to calendar
- 2 cancellation days or more students will shift to remote instruction as permissible by NYSED.

### **USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES**

#### **VISITORS**

In the event you must come to a school building, please arrange your visit in advance. Upon arrival, visitors must sign in at the security vestibules. Please be prepared to present and surrender photo identification upon arrival at all schools.



#### **BOARD OF EDUCATION**

The Board of Education comprises local residents who serve three-year terms without pay. Board members represent citizens in setting District policies, submitting a budget and appointing school personnel. To serve as a member of the school board, you must be a qualified voter and must be a resident of the District for a continuous and uninterrupted year immediately preceding the date of the election.

Board elections are held the third Tuesday in May at the same time as the budget vote. The Board delegates day-to-day administration of the schools to the superintendent. The superintendent works with administrators and District personnel to carry out the policies and procedures established by the Board of Education.

#### SCHOOL DISTRICT VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

To vote in School District elections, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States.
- 18 years of age or older.
- A resident of the District for at least 30 days.

The Board of Education has adopted the provisions of Education Law 2018-c, which requires all new persons offering to vote at any School District meeting or election to provide one acceptable form of proof of residency.

#### CALIFICACIONES DEL VOTANTE DEL DISTRITO ESCOLAR

Para votar en las elecciones del distrito escolar, debe ser:

- Un ciudadano de los Estados Unidos.
- 18 años de edad o más.
- Un residente del distrito por al menos 30 días.

La Junta de Educación ha adoptado las disposiciones de Educación Ley 2018-c, que exige que todas las personas nuevas que se ofrecen a votar en cualquier reunión o elección del distrito escolar para proporcionar una forma aceptable de prueba de residencia.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

According to state law, all students must attend school regularly when they are physically and mentally able to do so. Legal absences include:

- Sickness
- Sickness or death in the family
- Religious observance

- Required court appearances
- Approved school-sponsored activities

Parents are required to call the child's school to report absences. When the child returns to school, a written explanation with the dates and reasons for the absence must be provided.

#### **HOME TUTORING**

This service is provided for a student who will be absent from school for an extended period of time. Any prolonged illness or physical disability must be verified by a physician before home tutoring can be provided. Home tutoring may be provided in person or through a distance learning model.

#### STUDENT ACCIDENT CO-INSURANCE

Student insurance will be provided by the School District for all pupils. Generally, the District plan includes coverage from the time the pupil gets on the bus in the morning until the time of leaving the bus in the afternoon. There will be full coverage (reasonable and customary) within the plan limits for the part of the claim that is not covered by parents' personal health insurance. For a claim to be valid, it should be reported in writing immediately to school officials. All after-school activities, intramural and interscholastic athletics are also covered.

### NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY

The Port Jefferson School District complies with both state and federal regulations and laws with regard to employment and educational opportunity. Discrimination on any basis is illegal. Questions or concerns may be reported to the Director of Special Education at 631-791-4241.

### SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY

Any student or employee of the School District who believes that he or she has been subjected to sexual harassment should report the alleged misconduct immediately to the Executive Director of Human Resources at 631-791-4236 for appropriate action under District policy.

### ACCESS TO STUDENTS AND STUDENT RECORDS

Parents, guardians and students over the age of 18 have the right to inspect and review educational records compiled by the District. The District has established procedures for this purpose. Student records are not made available to any outside agency, organization or individual without the written consent of the parent or guardian, except as required by law. Parents and students over the age of 18 may challenge confidential information to ensure that it is accurate. They may request correction or deletion of inaccuracies. The District is required to respect court orders regarding guardianship. The District is also constrained against permitting access to students by family or friends who do not have legal guardianship.

### TITLE 45 - RELEASE OF INFORMATION AND PRIVACY RIGHTS

Port Jefferson Schools may provide, release and publish information pertaining to students for public relations and directory information. The following may be supplied: name of student, names of parents, address, age, weight, height, grade, participation in recognized school activities, extracurricular activities, sports programs, academic honors, achievements, awards, scholarships and similar information. This information may be released in District and school publications and programs, as well as in press releases to the local media. Under Title 34 U.S. Code Part 99: Privacy Rights of Parents and Students, parents or guardians or students over the age of 18 who do not desire release of the above information must make a specific written request to the Superintendent of Schools by September 30 of each year. Failure to make such a request will be considered consent to release, provide or publish the information during the school year.

If you have questions concerning school procedures or functions, please contact the building principal. ### TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Information about your child's route and bus stop will be mailed to you prior to the beginning of the school year. Any further questions, please contact the transportation office at 631-791-4261. *The Port Jefferson School District encourages the appropriate use of seat belts for all grade levels.* 

#### LATE BUSES

Buses leave the Middle School/High School at approximately 3:10 p.m., 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. Buses leave the Elementary School at 4:30 p.m. Please note that late buses do not follow the regular dismissal routes. They make perimeter stops at corner intersections off a main road and children must walk to their home from there.

#### TEMPORARILY HANDICAPPED STUDENTS

The school nurse must be notified and provided with the proper documentation so that proper arrangements can be made for the transportation of temporarily handicapped Students.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

Specific questions regarding bus decorum, lost items, schedules, etc., should be referred to the appropriate building principal. Discipline problems are handled by the principals. Parents are notified in cases of disciplinary action. Excessive violation of the rules of conduct may lead to a student's loss of bus privileges.

#### PUPILS IN NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS

Pupils attending nonpublic schools may be eligible for school bus transportation, in accordance with New York State Education requirements. For information, contact the transportation office at 631-791-4261. The deadline for transportation requests for the following school year is April 1.

### ADA AND SECTION 504 REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

The Port Jefferson School District has a nondiscrimination policy regarding disabilities. Therefore, no qualified disabled individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity. Should assistance be needed to access a program or facility, please contact the Section 504 compliance officer at 631-791-4241.

#### **ADMISSION TO SCHOOL**

Central registration for all schools is located at the Administration Building. Call 631-791-4291 for registration information. To enter pre-kindergarten, children must be 4 years old on or before December 1 of the school year. To enter kindergarten, children must be 5 years old on or before December 1 of the school year. Children of nonresidents of the District may be admitted by the Board of Education upon recommendation of the superintendent of schools, upon payment of tuition as set by the Board, and upon other terms that the Board may set. New entrants are screened to ensure proper placement.

### SPECIAL EDUCATION

To meet the needs of students with various levels of development and educational needs, specialized instructional programs and services are provided as a part of the regular education experience. All students have access to District programs, including extracurricular activities. A full continuum of special education services are offered to qualified students. For more information, contact the Office of Special Education at 631-791-4241.

#### PESTICIDE INFORMATION

New York Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the year. The Port Jefferson School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- Antimicrobial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children:
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA-designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA-designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects, including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. # DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT (DASA) EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012

The Dignity for All Students Act was established with the broad legislative intent to provide a school environment free of discrimination and harassment. Identified in the legislation are those who are subjected to intimidation or abuse based on actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender or sex (including gender identity and expression). The Port Jefferson School District has established policies intended to create a school environment that is free from discrimination or harassment. These policies are located on the District website under the heading BOE, Board Policies 0115.

### **EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT**

ESSA was signed into law in December 2015, replacing the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. The new law includes provisions that will help to ensure success for students and schools; namely,

- Advances equity by upholding critical protections for America's disadvantaged and high-need students.
- Requires that all students in America be taught to high academic standards that will prepare them to succeed in college and careers.
- Ensures that vital information is provided to educators, families, students and communities through annual statewide assessments that measure students' progress toward those high standards.
- Helps to support and grow local innovations, including evidence-based and place- based interventions developed by local leaders and educators, consistent with Investing in Innovation and Promise Neighborhoods.
- Sustains and expands historic investments in increasing access to high-quality preschool.
- Maintains an expectation that there will be accountability and action to effect positive change in our lowest-performing schools, where groups of students are not making progress, and where graduation rates are low over extended periods of time. For more information, visit http://www.ed.gov.



#### ROYAL EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

#### **WELLNESS POLICY**

The District has developed an extensive Wellness Policy to positively affect the health and education of students. Policy 5405, in compliance with New York State regulations, sets standards for food and beverages sold or provided to students during the school day and provides guidelines for the use of food in classrooms. Fundraising activities, both

during and outside of school hours, are also addressed. The policy addresses nutritional concerns as well as the implementation of increased physical activity throughout the school day. To view the Wellness Policy in full, please visit the District website.

#### PFML SEX OFFENDER ALERT PROGRAM

#### **VANDALISM**

School property belongs to all residents of the School District. If vandalism or other malicious damage to school facilities occurs, the guilty parties will be required to make full restitution in accordance with the laws of New York State.

# FEDERAL ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) is a federal law enacted in 1987 that requires all school districts to inspect and reinspect for asbestos-containing building materials every three years. Our facilities have been inspected and response actions have been developed to ensure a continued safe environment for our students and employees. Activities include training of custodial and maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos and periodical reinspection and surveillance activities by trained personnel. The Asbestos Management Plan and reinspection reports available for your review are located in the Plant Facilities Administrators Office, as well as the main office of each school building.

As required by the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, our schools were initially inspected for asbestos in 1988. The inspection resulted in the development of an Asbestos Management Plan, which was implemented in 1989. The results of our latest, 2019, inspection, as well as the Asbestos Management Plan are available for inspection by contacting the Facilities Director, Robert Minarik, Port Jefferson School District, 550 Scraggy Hill Road, Port Jefferson, NY 11777, 631-791-4261.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

The following is a summary of students' rights and responsibilities according to the Port Jefferson School District's Code of Conduct. Unless otherwise noted, this code applies to all students, school personnel, parents and other visitors when on school property or attending a school function. 
The District is committed to safeguarding the rights given to all students under federal and state law and District policy. In addition, to promote a safe, healthy, orderly and supportive school environment, all District students have the right to:

- 1. Take part in all District activities on an equal basis regardless of actual or perceived race, weight, color, creed, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, gender (including gender identity and expression) or sexual orientation, or disability.
- 2. To be respected as an individual and treated fairly and with dignity by other students and school staff.
- 3. To express one's opinions, either verbally or in writing, as long as it is done in a respectful manner.
- 4. Present their version of the relevant events to school personnel authorized to impose consequences.
- 5. Access school policies, regulations and rules and,when necessary, receive an explanation of those rules from school personnel.
- 6. To be provided with clear expectations regarding:
  - a. Course objectives, requirements and state standards;
  - b. Grading criteria and procedures;
  - c. Assignment requirements and deadlines; and
  - d. School and classroom rules and expectations regarding behavior.

#### STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

All students have the responsibility to:

- 1. Contribute to maintaining a safe, supportive and orderly school environment that is conducive to learning and to show respect to other persons and to property.
- 2. Help make school a community free of violence, intimidation, bullying, harassment and discrimination.
- 3. Be familiar with and abide by District policies, rules and regulations dealing with student conduct.
- 4. Attend school every day unless they are legally excused and be in class, on time, and prepared to learn, unless suspended from instruction.
- 5. Work to the best of their ability in all academic and extracurricular pursuits and strive toward their highest level of achievement possible.
- 6. React to direction given by teachers, administrators and other school personnel in a respectful, positive manner.
- 7. Use a polite tone of voice and appropriate body language, listening when others are speaking to them.
- 8. To be truthful when speaking with school officials regarding Code of Conduct violations.
- 9. Respect personal space.
- 10. Work to develop mechanisms to manage their emotions and reactions and resolve conflict with others.
- 11. Ask questions when they do not understand.
- 12. To assist in resolving problems that might contribute to inappropriate behavior.
- 13. Dress appropriately for school and school functions.
- 14. Accept responsibility for their actions.
- 15. Conduct themselves as representatives of the District when participating in or attending school-sponsored extracurricular events and to hold themselves to the highest standards of conduct, demeanor and sportsmanship.











### CODE OF CONDUCT

#### **DRESS CODE**

All students are expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to dress appropriately for school and school functions. Students and their parents have the primary responsibility for acceptable student dress and appearance. Teachers and all other District personnel should exemplify and reinforce acceptable student dress and help students develop an understanding of appropriate appearance in the school setting. A student's dress, grooming and appearance, including hair style/ color, jewelry, makeup and nails, shall be safe, appropriate and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process. Each Building Principal or his or her designee shall be responsible for informing all students and their parents of the student dress code at the beginning of the school year and any revisions to the dress code made during the school year.

#### ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

The NYS Budget approved by lawmakers in May 2025 created a new Section 2803 of the Education Law which provides for the general prohibition of the use of internet-enabled devices by students, during the school day, anywhere on school grounds.

The term "internet-enabled devices" includes any smartphone, tablet, smartwatch, or other device capable of connecting to the internet and enabling the user to access content on the internet, including social media applications. Devices that do not connect to the internet, as well as internet-enabled devices that are provided to students by the School District for an educational purpose (e.g., School District issued Chromebooks, iPad, or other computer), are not included within the scope of prohibited devices.

As defined in the new provision, "school day" encompasses the entire instructional day including, but not limited to, homeroom periods, lunch, recess, study halls, and passing time. "School grounds" includes any building, structure, athletic playing field, playground, or land contained within the real property boundary line of a District elementary, intermediate, junior high, vocational, or high school, a charter school, or a BOCES facility.

Principal and/or General Office phone numbers are published for parent/guardian use annually in this calendar. Parent/guardian messages can be delivered to students, and students are permitted to use a main office phone for the purpose of contacting a parent or guardian.

Students in grades K-5 are not permitted to have internetenabled devices in school. Students in grades 6-12 are strongly encouraged to leave all internet-enabled devices at home. Should students in grades 6-12 feel the need to bring internet-enabled devices to school, they must be stored in their school-issued locker for the duration of the school day. The District is not responsible for loss or damage to internet-enabled devices on school grounds.

Other than a student's use of an internet-enabled device in accordance with an IEP or 504 Plan, the following reasons are the only permitted uses of internet-enabled devices: (a) authorized by a teacher, principal, or the School District, charter school, or BOCES for a specific educational purpose, (b) necessary for the management of a student's healthcare, (c) in the event of an emergency (as determined by the school or District), (d) for translation services, (e) on a case-by-case basis, upon review and determination by a school psychologist, school social worker, or school counselor, for a student caregiver who is routinely responsible for the care and wellbeing of a family member, or (f) required by law.
